Sewanee's 10,000 forested acres on the Cumberland Plateau – called the Domain – are crisscrossed by trails, streams, caves and waterfalls providing a living laboratory to study such disciplines as biology, geology and archeology. Nestled among the old growth trees are gothic-inspired buildings hewn from native sandstone where award-winning professors help challenge and broaden the perspective of motivated, highly skilled students.

The 1,467 undergraduate men and women select from 35 majors, which combine the study of literature, science, philosophy, languages and history. A top 35 nationally ranked liberal arts school, Sewanee has a solid record of academic achievement which includes 25 Rhodes Scholars and 26 Postgraduate Scholarship recipients.

Sewanee competes at the NCAA Division III level and is a charter member of the Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference with 24 varsity sports.

2006 VOLLEYBALL OUTLOOK

Second year head coach Joe Dombrowski has five returning starters for the 2006 season. The returners bring a great deal of experience and leadership to the 2006 squad.

Offensively the team is led by ESPN *The Magazine* Academic All-American outside hitter **Jean Anne Babin** (Sr., Huntsville, Ala.). Babin, who missed most of the 2005 campaign due to an injury, was seventh in NCAA Div. III in kills per game (5.08) in 2004 and has led the Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference in that category for two of the past three years.

Three-year starter and court leader **Lauren Mathis** (Sr., Louisville, Ky.) returns at setter where she had 8.41 assists per game in 2004 and 9.71 in 2003. These numbers should improve this season with the added depth at the outside and middle hitter positions.

Right side **Carey Donald** (Jr., Birmingham, Ala.) was the biggest addition to last years offense. This year she is a key component in the Tigers offense once again.

Mary Alice Mathison (Sr., Pensacola, Fla.) splits her time between right side and outside hitting duties this fall. Mathison — a three-sport athlete (volleyball, basketball, track and field) — had 0.68 kills and .90 digs per game with 53 career service aces.

Two other returners made significant contributions in 2005. Middle hitter **Brittany Roper** (So., El Paso, Texas) is once again called upon to be a strong blocking presence as well as a solid part of the team's offense in 2006. Libero **Ashley McGowan** (Sr., Whitwell, Tenn.) saw extensive playing time in 2004 as she had 3.02 digs per game and 18 service aces. This year she is the team's primary passer and defensive specialist.

The team has a solid mix of additional returners and rookies. These include middle blockers **Katie Thomas** (So., Birmingham, Ala.) and **Mary Beth Epps** (Fr., Memphis, Tenn.), outside hitters **Terri Reynolds** (Jr., Dallas, Texas), **Leisha Meade** (Fr., Sevierville, Tenn.) and defensive specialist **Erin Smyth** (Fr., Mechanicsville, Va.). All of these players are expected to contribute to the squad's success this season.

Playing a competitive schedule, the Tigers are members of the strong SCAC. They begin their season at the Johns Hopkins/Asics Invitational in Baltimore, Md. and then compete all season against good out of conference competition to prepare them for their rigorous conference schedule.

HEAD COACH

JOE DOMBROWSKI is in his second season as Sewanee's head volleyball coach. He also serves as the assistant track and field coach in the spring.

The Baltimore, Md. native served as the interim head volleyball coach at SUNY-Oneonta (13-21) in 1998, and had eight years experience as an assistant coach at Johns Hopkins (1993-1997) and Hartwick College (2002-2004).

With 16 years of collegiate coaching experience (volleyball & cross country/track & field), Dombrowski came to Sewanee after serving as assistant cross-country/track & field coach for the 2004-05 school year at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute (RPI) in Troy, N.Y.

He has a B.S. degree in political science from Goucher College (Md.) (1993) and an A.A. degree in political science from Essex Community College (Md.) (1989). He and his wife Michele have a 2-month-old daughter, Anja and live in Sewanee.
