The Henry Clay Center for Statesmanship promotes the principles and practices of statesmanship as exemplified by the great Kentucky Statesman, Henry Clay. Our mission is to educate a new generation of leaders in diplomacy, dialogue, negotiation, beneficial compromise, and conflict resolution. Every year the Henry Clay Center recruits fifty of the brightest rising college seniors to represent each of the 50 states in our annual College Student Congress, a week-long academic program hosted on the campus of the University of Kentucky where students engage in policy projects, lectures, and activities designed to develop their skills in the areas of leadership, cooperation, and negotiation. The Henry Clay Center seeks students with the following characteristics:

- Excellent academic performance, as evidenced by GPA and a rigorous collegiate curriculum
- Participation in relevant coursework such as history, government, political science, and international relations
- Participation in relevant extracurricular activities
- Clear record of integrity, service, and leadership
- Interest in pursuing a related career

Applications are available online at www.henryclaycenter.org, and are due February 16, 2018. Following the application deadline, the Henry Clay Center will work with elected officials from each of the 50 states to select one student representative, as well as alternates, for each state from the applicant pool.
