STATEMENT OF RESPONSIBILITY AND ASSUMPTION OF RISK REGARDING EUROPEAN STUDIES

The undersigned is a student seeking enrollment in European Studies (hereinafter referred to as "E.S." and the "program"). In consideration for acceptance into the program, the undersigned agrees to the obligations and considerations set forth herein. Reference in these conditions to European Studies shall include all officers, trustees, employees, agents and related parties of European Studies, individually and collectively, as well as those of Rhodes College and The University of the South. Reference in these conditions to "participants" shall include all students who have been accepted into the program. All reference herein to "the parents" of the participants shall include the legal guardians or other adults responsible for the applicant.

- 1. Behavioral Responsibilities.** All participants will at all times comply with rules, standards, and instructions for student behavior set forth by E.S. and Lincoln College. The program reserves the right to enforce appropriate standards of conduct and specifically reserves the right to terminate participation in the program by anyone who fails to maintain these standards or for any action or conduct which E.S. considers to be incompatible with the interests, harmony, comfort, and welfare of other participants. It is important that participants conduct themselves in an entirely honorable manner during their association with this program, and avoid any act that might reasonably be construed as lying, cheating, or stealing.
- 2. Deposit.** E.S. reserves the right to accept or reject any proposed participant, and the receipt for the deposit does not constitute acceptance to the program. An application is deemed rejected or accepted on the dispatch of a notification of rejection or acceptance. If an application is rejected for any reason, the deposit will be refunded in full.
- 3. Release of Liability.** The undersigned releases E.S., any tour organizer or arranger, any host college or hostel, and all employees and agents of the foregoing, from any and all claims, demands, or suits for personal injury, death, property damage, loss, expenses, or other damages, of whatever nature and howsoever caused, arising out of or related in any way to the undersigned's participation in the program including, but not limited to, claims or damages resulting from: delay; the criminal acts of others; the use of any vehicle; strike; war; a threat or act of terrorism; weather; sickness; quarantine; any governmental restriction or regulation; or any act or omission by any steamship line, airline, railroad, ferry, coachline, taxi service, hotel, restaurant, college, or any other person. E.S. is not responsible for the welfare of participants during periods of independent travel. Participants are urged to have personal insurance for such contingencies.
- 4. Academic Responsibility.** For the satisfactory completion of the course for credit, participants are expected to attend all lectures, seminars, and required excursions and to complete all assignments and examinations in a timely way.
- 5. Photos.** Participants consent to the use of their photographs, comments, and photographic likenesses by E.S. for publicity purposes insofar as E.S. may in its discretion think fit.
- 6. Health and Safety.** E.S. reserves the right to take whatever action it may consider warranted by circumstances relating to the health and safety of the participants, and the undersigned hereby releases E.S. from any liability for such decisions or actions.
- 7. Medical Services.** The participant hereby authorizes E.S. and its agents and employees at their discretion without obtaining any further consent to arrange such medical services and treatment as may be deemed necessary for the participants at the sole risk and expense of the participants or their parents. If deemed necessary or desirable by E.S., any participant may be returned to the United States by commercial airline or other means for medical treatment at the risk and expense of the participant or parents. Participants are strongly advised to have an insurance policy to cover such risks.
- 8. Property Damage.** Should a participant damage or lose property belonging to E.S. or any other college, hotel, or hostel, or to any individual associated with any of the foregoing, the participant agrees to indemnify the injured party and to accept such penalty as the Dean may reasonably impose. The participant also agrees to discharge all other indebtedness or obligations to E.S. before the conclusion of the program and understands that a failure to do so may result in the withholding of credit and the payment of administrative fees for the subsequent discharge of these obligations.
- 9. Indemnity.** The participant agrees to assume the liability for, and to indemnify and defend E.S. and its agents from, any and all loss, liability, claims, damages, or expenses arising, either wholly or in part, out of the actions or omissions of the participant.
- 10. Substance Abuse Policy.** The sale, distribution, use or possession of a controlled drug or substance, or unauthorized prescription while a participant on this program represents a serious breach of conduct and will result in expulsion from the program and notification of the appropriate officials of the parent institution and / or others who may be concerned. Also, to be present, though not a participant, during a violation of this policy will in itself be deemed reprehensible and subject to penalty.
- 11. Termination Policy.** Should a student be compelled to withdraw for good reason before beginning of the semester, the Office of European Studies will undertake to determine what portion of the room, board and travel may be recoverable, bearing in mind that arrangements for travel abroad must be secured well in advance with full or substantial partial payment. Students withdrawing after April 15th without good reason will be subject to a late withdrawal fee of \$3000.00. After instruction has begun, a pro rata refund of board only may be allowable, at the discretion of the Office of E.S. If any participant should have his or her participation terminated, then E.S. shall have the right to require the participant to quit the program without refund of fees.
- 12. Travel Arrangements.** E.S. will endeavor to adhere to all arrangements made but nevertheless reserves the right to change or alter any arrangement of location or content of the program or travel arrangements should E.S. deem such alteration necessary.
- 13. Cancellation Policy.** In the event of cancellation of an entire session of this program before commencement of the program, all monies paid to E.S. prior to that time will be refunded. Should an unavoidable event such as epidemic, civil unrest, or the threat of terrorist activity result in a partial cancellation, a *pro rata* refund of all fees, together with an appropriate evaluation of academic credit, will follow. These actions will terminate any further liability on the part of E.S.
- 14. Document Responsibility.** No responsibility is accepted by E.S. for failure by participants to carry the relevant passports, visas, tickets, or other documents required for the purpose of travel or for their loss or replacement.
- 15. Fee Payments.** The comprehensive fee for the sixteen-week semester, including all services, benefits and instruction described in the official notice of European Studies is covered by Rhodes and Sewanee's semester tuition, room and board rate. The Finance offices of Rhodes and Sewanee will bill and receipt students for their semester abroad on ES. The comprehensive fee for students from other institutions is equivalent to the Rhodes semester tuition, room and full board rate.
